

#### The Arc of Illinois

Rooted in Reality: A Statewide Call for IDD System Change

### Impact:

In Year 1, we aim to capture the real, unmet needs of people with IDD and their families across Illinois through eight regional events and a statewide summit. By collecting direct input and video documentation from individuals, families, and provider communities we'll build a public-facing report and dashboard to drive targeted policy change. Alongside identifying gaps and challenges, we'll also highlight what's working well across the state to help replicate effective practices. A focused waiver access study will ensure family voices shape reform. This work lays the groundwork for a unified, data-driven movement rooted in lived experience.

## **Year 1 Objectives:**

- Statewide Listening & Data Collection Tour
  - Host 8 regional, in-person events across Illinois from Cairo to Rockford equally split across rural, urban, and suburban settings.
  - Use a standardized data collection survey as well as video documentation to gather firsthand experiences, unmet needs, and system gaps from:
    - Individuals with IDD (with supports as needed)
    - Family Caregivers
    - People currently living in provider settings (group homes, CILAs, ICFs)
    - Individuals currently living in State Operated Developmental Centers (SODCs)
    - Focus areas: housing, waiver access, transition support, employment, behavioral health, social connection, safety, dignity, and service gaps.

### Launch Statewide Policy + Lived Experience Summit (Chicago or Springfield)

- Culminating event bringing together all stakeholders: families, selfadvocates, providers, policy leaders, researchers, and advocates.
- Present synthesized findings from regional events.



 Facilitate solution-driven breakout sessions to generate aligned action across sectors.

# Data Analysis & Reporting

- Partner with University of Illinois Chicago (UIC) to analyze qualitative and quantitative findings.
- Build a public-facing dashboard and interactive report that breaks down needs by region, demographic, and service type.
- Identify at least 5 high-impact recommendations to influence state planning, waiver redesign, and rate reform.

### Waiver Access & Navigation Study

- Deep dive into barriers to accessing or understanding the Medicaid waiver system (across all entry points: PUNS, ISCs, schools, families, and providers).
- Partner with self-advocacy mentors and family support groups to ensure tools are accessible and inclusive.
- Align findings with Going Home Coalition, DDD, and ICDD to build united reform recommendations.

### Year 1 Outcomes:

- First **statewide**, **user-informed report** detailing unmet needs for individuals with IDD and families, with breakdowns by age, geography, and living situation.
- Established **regional feedback infrastructure** that can be updated annually and replicated by partners.
- 8 regional events hosted with high attendance and cross-sector representation.
- 1 large-scale statewide Summit with over 300 participants.
- UIC-analyzed dataset and report used to shape state policy priorities.
- Waiver Access Recommendations Report delivered to key state agencies and policymakers.



 Foundation laid for launching Year 2 targeted reforms, pilot programs, and legislative asks based on community-defined priorities.

- Unmet Needs Statewide Report (with region-specific snapshots)
- Public Data Dashboard
- Waiver Access Barriers Report
- Advocacy + Awareness Infographic (for families and community allies)
